Practical-professional profile of the course and industry sector of reference	<p>The course contents, highly interdisciplinary, are aimed at training expert professionals in the design/planning and management of landscape and open spaces, in landscape and environmental redevelopment, in the active and dynamic conservation of gardens and historic sites. The Master aims to provide a series of technical, cultural and methodological tools, useful for tackling the landscape project in different contexts and at different scales, from the strategic vision to the executive detail.</p> <p>With reference to the declarations of IFLA/AIAPP (International Federation of Landscape Architects, Italian Association of Landscape Architecture) and ECLAS (European Council of Landscape Architecture Schools) and considering the curricular background of each member,</p> <p>the professional profile we aim to train is that of a specialist in the plan/project/management of open spaces, gardens and landscapes, which is also particularly valued in the missions/challenges/actions of the PNRR 2021/2022.</p>

The test is aimed at verifying	Specific interest in the discipline of landscape architecture, previous educational and professional experiences and the aptitude for understanding the dynamics and processes that characterize the different types of open spaces (historical and/or contemporary) at all scales.

Teaching methods	Presence lessons
Language of instruction	Italian
Attendance requirements	Attendance is mandatory for at least 70% of each of the laboratories. Since the Master is aimed at graduates, but also professionals and employees of public bodies, it is possible to agree attendance formulas based on needs.
Location of the course	The teaching activities take place at the Department of Architecture (DIDA), Via della Mattonaia 8, Florence and (for Saturday) at the Department of Education, Languages, Interculture, Literature and Psychology (FORLILPSI), Via Laura 48, Florence .
Foreseen lecture schedule	Lessons take place fortnightly on Thursdays and Fridays (9.30-13.30 and 14.30-18.30) and on Saturday mornings (9.30-13.30)
Examinations procedures and schedule	The methods of verification of the training activities consist of exams with a mark expressed out of thirty and possible mention of honors or with a judgment of suitability in the cases foreseen and communicated to the Student Administrative Secretariat by the Master's Coordinator.
Final examination	The final test consists in the complete development of a landscape project.

Description of the activities and training objectives of the internship.	<p>The professionals enrolled in the Master's course also carry out an internship period (12 CFU) aimed at acquiring in the field the applied skills and operational tools of the landscape architect profession in the plan, project, active conservation and management of green areas, gardens, parks , urban, historical and contemporary open spaces.</p> <p>This activity is carried out, subject to the stipulation of a specific convention or other type of agreement with the Florentine University, at one of the host entities selected from professional landscape architecture firms, in Italy and abroad, administrations, offices of territorial bodies and/or or protection (Municipalities, Region, SABAP...), research centers, nurseries specialized in production, and other types of areas that carry out activities related to the professional practice of the landscape architect.
